From One Season to the Next

Ecclesiastes 3:1 says, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." The word "season" in both secular and Bible dictionaries is defined as "an appointed time." For example, we say it is "baseball season" meaning that these months of the year are the "appointed time" to play baseball, whereas other months of the year are designated for the playing of other sports. If baseball were played year-round — which some of us wouldn't have a problem with — there would be no need to call it a "baseball season" because there would not be a time when the sport wasn't played. In short, for something to be a season, it must have a beginning and an end.

As we enter the month of May, we are coming upon the end of a season in the life of Schoeneck Moravian Church and in all of our lives. The season we are referring to is the appointed time in which God called us to serve in ministry with you as pastors of this congregation. Our ministry with you began in January of 2018 and will be ending in just a few weeks. With the end of seasons, we often experience a mix of emotions. There is sometimes a sadness of seeing one thing end. There might also be an anticipation of what is coming next. And there may be a wondering of what we were to have learned or gained from the period of time that is coming to a close.

The Bible is replete with examples of "seasons." We remember how Jesus was with His disciples in bodily form for a set period of time. Then, after dying and rising again, He departed from them to ascend to heaven. There He will remain until a particular time, until a "day and hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only" (Matthew 24:36). There were distinct periods of time when Jesus was here in the flesh, times when He is not — such as now — and a time when He will be again. Even His arrival to earth as a baby is described in the language of seasons: "But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4).

The apostle Paul also talks about seasons of his ministry. He served the church in Ephesus for three years. But after those three years, He felt the Spirit compelling Him to move onward to Jerusalem. He said to the Elders of the church, "And now, behold, I am going to Jerusalem, constrained by the Spirit..." (Acts 20:22). God called Paul to be with the church in Ephesus for a set time, and eventually that time was up. Paul was also clear that there was a purpose to the time that he spent with the different churches to which God had called him to minister. To the Corinthian church he said, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth...according to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building upon it" (1 Corinthians 3:6,10). Paul's purpose in his season with them was to lay a foundation. Now as Paul was no longer present with the people, it was someone else's season to build upon that foundation.

Seasons are how God works, using His servants in particular times, at particular places, for particular reasons. Our season together began five years ago, and it's safe to say that all of our lives were different those years ago. Maybe over these five years, you or your family have experienced a trial, and by God's grace we were able to minister to you as your pastors. We know that in our family, we did face a trial. In 2019 Pastor Sanette underwent surgery. It was a difficult time, but you all ministered to us in supportive ways that we deeply needed. In these last five years we have learned and practiced new ways of sharing the witness of Jesus Christ with our community, as we expanded the reach of our community dinners and got out in our community during the Nazareth community days in the summer. These are just small examples, but they are counted among the reasons for our season together. In these last five years we have also faced challenges together that have refined our character and called us into deeper relationship with God. This too was another reason for our season together.

God ultimately has greater purposes for our lives than we know, and we cannot always see it at the time. Ultimately, wherever we are and wherever we are called, we are to "live for the Lord" (Romans 14:8).

We are grateful to have lived this season with all of you. Over these last few years, we have developed special relationships with you. We have done valuable ministry together, often involving sweat and tears. We have learned important lessons from being with each other. We thank the Lord Jesus for all He has done in this time we have shared.

In departing from here, we pray that you will continue steadfastly in the work of the Lord, as we strive to do the same. May the Lord strengthen you, uphold you, protect you, and guide you in paths of righteousness for His name's sake. May you remember to "always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58). May you always look to the Lord for your strength, being reminded that He is "your refuge and strength, and ever-present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1). And may you always remember to give God the glory, not yourselves, for Jesus is the reason we are able to do what we do: "To Him who loves us and has released us from our sins by His blood, who has made us to be a kingdom of priests to His God and Father — to Him be the glory and power forever and ever! Amen." (Revelation 1:5)

In remembering family, we will also take time to thank God for the mothers in our congregation on this Mother's Day.




ASCENSION SUNDAY/Pastors' Last Sunday — 10:30 A.M. worship only

PENTECOST/MEMORIAL DAY





Last Month to Contribute to the Organ Fund!



Can you believe it? Only 18 months ago we began our fund-raising for the organ restoration. We reached our \$120,000 goal on Palm Sunday, a very appropriate date. We have almost raised the entire contracted cost of the work, which comes to \$122,000. You will receive one more pink organ envelope for May, and we will continue to accept funds for this project until the end of May. If you want to help, there is still time to be a part of this important achievement for the congregation. Any funds not needed for this restoration will be put into a new "Organ Maintenance" Fund for future work.

We still do not have a date when the organ will be returned. This is the difficult part of any project: waiting. The organ parts are in Lancaster being cleaned, refurbished, repaired. The area in the belfry above the pipe chamber has been waterproofed. The inside of the pipe chamber has been cleaned. New plaster has been added to the exterior wall at the back (plaster was flaking and falling, although no one could see it until the pipes were removed). The wood of the pipe chamber has been cleaned and refinished. Everything is ready for the pipes and the organ to come home. We just don't know when that will be.

Keep watch for notice when the organ will be returned, and for the celebration events the Organ Restoration Task Force is planning. For now, we give thanks to God that we have been able to accomplish this goal.

Once you have decided on the date and time for your meeting or event, you need to fill out a Building Request Form and sign it. Both Elders and Trustees must approve all meetings and events, so you need to do this well in advance. This helps everyone know what is happening in our building, and helps with scheduling so that events do not conflict.

There are fees to use the various areas of the church, even for Schoeneck members. The member fees are less than for non-members. All outside organizations who use church facilities pay the non-member fee, even if a Schoeneck member belongs to that organization and is requesting the use of the rooms. The office can furnish you with a list of fees and rules for the use of church Facilities. Cindi in the office can answer your questions and offer assistance if necessary.
