MORAVIAN CALL SYSTEM BASICS or Moravian Call 101

As Schoeneck begins the process of calling a new pastor (or pastors), we want to tell you briefly how this process works. In the Moravian Church, a pastor is neither assigned by the denomination nor elected by the vote of the congregation. Instead, denominational officials and the local Joint Board confer in order to find the pastor that will meet the needs of the congregation. Moravians believe the leading of the Holy Spirit is clearly part of our call process. Steps in the process are:

- 1. The District Board is responsible for initiating the call process. Its representatives meet with the Joint Board to help identify the needs of this parish. Through congregational assessment, the District Board will carefully match Schoeneck's needs with the strengths of the ordained women and men who might be available for call. The Joint Board can also suggest names, which the District Board will then review to discern their appropriateness and availability. This step will begin soon.
- 2. The next step is for the District President to meet again with the Joint Board in order to present biographical and evaluative material on the recommended clergy decided upon in Step 1.
- 3. Following in-depth discussion, the Joint Board members vote. When two-thirds of the total board membership agrees on a potential pastor, and after working out the terms of the call (such as salary, housing, travel expense, continuing education, etc.), the District President issues the call to the pastor in the name of the Moravian Church, Northern Province. Remember that the Joint Board serves as the personnel committee; the congregation does not vote to call a pastor.
- 4. Unless the called pastor feels no leading by God to the congregation, a ministry dialogue will take place with the Joint Board and the called Pastor. A member of the EDEB will be present.
- 5. Following the ministry dialogue meeting, the Joint Board will vote to reconfirm (or not) the original call to the Pastor. This also requires a 2/3 vote of the total membership of the Joint Board. The Pastor will be notified of the Joint Board action.
- 6. Should the call be reaffirmed, the Pastor sends a written reply to the call to the District President and the Joint Board is notified of the response. If the call is accepted, that will be announced to the congregation. If it is declined, the District President and the Joint Board will meet again to pursue the process further, returning to step #2. No announcement will be made to the congregation.

Long experience with the call system indicates:

- 1. That it is democratic in nature.
- 2. That democracy can move slowly sometimes.
- 3. That the local church benefits from the help which the denomination can give and a real partnership can develop.
- 4. Responsibility and choice are shared by the local church, the denomination, and the pastor.
- 5. That if the pastor who is called declines the call, it does not imply a negative judgment on the congregation but, rather, a sense of no clear leading of the Lord to accept.
- 6. That the leading of the Holy Spirit has repeatedly been demonstrated to be active in the call process.

The Joint Board and the District Board will keep the entire process confidential. Members of the congregation must respect the need for secrecy by not pressuring the Joint Board members for advance information. As soon as there is something to announce, the congregation will know the results. We do not anticipate a conclusion to the search until this fall *at the earliest*.

Responsibility of the Board of Elders

Since the departure of Pastors Garritt and Sanette Fleming on May 21 after blessing our congregation with five (5) years of ministry, all spiritual leadership of Schoeneck Moravian Church becomes the responsibility of the Board of Elders. It was the decision of the Board of Elders along with the support of the Eastern District President Rev. Melissa Johnson, to utilize supply pastors and lay leaders for Sunday worship until a permanent full-time minister is installed at Schoeneck. Without pastoral guidance, the Elders will try their absolute best to provide this spiritual guidance and leadership. Below is a summary of the duties and responsibilities of the Board of Elders.

- 1. Provide the spiritual direction and leadership of the Schoeneck congregation with the following duties:
 - a. Organize worship services.
 - b. Arrange for supply pastors and lay leaders to provide spiritual guidance with a sermon/message each Sunday.
 - c. Set up Emergency Pastoral Care to attend to those members requiring immediate care (ex. Funeral, hospitalization, etc.).
 - d. Manage all building use requests.
 - e. Manage/direct as necessary all hospital visits.
 - f. Responsible for answering calls left over the weekend on the office answering machine for church/congregational issues and forward as needed.
 - g. Work cooperatively with the Board of Trustees on all Joint Board issues.
- 2. With the Board of Trustees, initiate and work through the call process with the Eastern District of the Northern Province of the Moravian Church to identify a person to serve as full-time pastor of Schoeneck.

The Elders ask for your prayers as we perform these duties as well as those items that come up and need to be addressed. We also ask for your patience as we manage this uncertain time, knowing that God will identify the name we need to consider to become the next full-time pastor at Schoeneck.


Sunday, June 18 Father's Day

Building Use Requests and Fees:

Ever wonder what is happening at church on a particular day? Are you trying to plan an event at the church and wonder if the day or time is free? The online calendar at Schoeneck's webpage (www.schoeneckmoravian.org/calendar) will answer your questions! It might save you a phone call or an e-mail to Cindi.

Once you have decided on the date and time for your meeting or event, you need to fill out a Building Request Form and sign it. Both Elders and Trustees must approve all meetings and events, so you need to do this well in advance. This helps everyone know what is happening in our building, and helps with scheduling so that events do not conflict.

There are fees to use the various areas of the church, even for Schoeneck members. The member fees are less than for non-members. All outside organizations who use church facilities pay the non-member fee, even if a Schoeneck member belongs to that organization and is requesting the use of the rooms. The office can furnish you with a list of fees and rules for the use of church Facilities. Cindi in the office can answer your questions and offer assistance if necessary.

Good News, Bad News

The good news: The restoration company has told us they are "proceeding at a good pace" with ORGAN FUND our organ. Our "new and improved" organ will be starting to come back soon.

The bad news: They discovered something additional that will need to be repaired, either now or later. It has to do with the wind system, which regulates the air flow to the pipes. There are three regulators which keep the supply and pressure of the air flow constant. One is currently in their shop to be rebuilt because of water damage. One is in their shop to be adjusted because it has been making a noise. One is still in our pipe chamber because there seemed to be no reason to work on it. All three seem to have been reused in a previous major organ restoration.

When Brunner started to rebuild the water-damaged one, which pretty much involves taking the thing entirely apart, they noticed that the leather and rubber-cloth (which makes the inside air-tight) was glued incorrectly. They checked the other regulator in their shop, and it is put together in the same (improper) way. When a crew was at Schoeneck recently, they looked at the one regulator still in our pipe chamber, and it is the same construction. From the outside, they still look to be in good shape. It was only when they started taking one apart that they could tell the regulators were improperly constructed.

One water-damaged regulator will be rebuilt properly at no additional charge, since fixing it was in the contract. However, they recommend that the other two regulators also be rebuilt properly. Now is obviously the time to have the work done, since everything is already at their workshop or easy to get there. Putting the work off until later would involve additional cost and additional time in the future without the organ.

The additional cost is \$7,920. At the May meeting the Trustees approved spending the additional \$8,000 to have the work done. This takes us to the \$130,000 that was approved for the work by Church Council in October of 2021.

We will continue to raise money for the organ for as long as necessary. To continue giving, simply use a blank envelope and add your name, envelope number (if you have one and know it), and write "Organ Fund" on the envelope. There are also envelopes with organ labels by the poster at each entrance, and on top of the drop box by the elevator. After raising \$122,000, an additional \$8,000 should be possible.

It is a disappointment that we are not finished fund-raising, but the project continues. We are confident that, with God's continuing help and guidance, we will raise the additional funds just as we have raised the rest of the money. We still have much to be thankful for.
