Discerning the word of God for our Daily Living

In the June newsletter, we read about the 'Moravian Call System Basics', an explanation summarizing the call process used to identify and bring a full-time pastor to Schoeneck. Throughout this process, the Eastern District Executive Board (EDEB) asks the Joint Board to pray along with quiet reflection and discernment on the name of a pastor who could meet the needs of the congregation as identified in the surveys recently sent to the congregation and Joint Board. While going through this process as well as other important issues, what is meant by the word 'discernment'? What does it mean to 'discern'? According to my search using Google (years ago we used a dictionary!!), discernment is a noun for 'the ability to judge well' or 'the quality of being able to grasp and comprehend what is obscure'. From a Christian perspective, discernment means to 'obtain spiritual guidance and understanding'. It is very important to use spiritual guidance and understanding to identify our next full-time pastor. But....how do we discern the word of God for our daily living?

In 2022, I was asked to prayerfully consider to accept an appointment to the Board of Elders to fill a current vacancy. Prior to this appointment, I had served on the Board of Elders for two (2) consecutive three (3)-year terms, ending at the 2021 Annual Church Council meeting. At that time, I told myself I no longer needed to serve on a church board, being glad to continue singing in the senior choir as my contribution to the church. However, while praying about the request, I continued to hear 'that small voice' telling me to consider accepting the appointment and subsequent nomination for a three (3)-year term. What was 'that small voice'? It was the Holy Spirit helping me make an important decision, i.e., discernment. According to Philippians 1:10, "....you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ", when we truly need to make an important decision, the Holy Spirit intercedes by providing spiritual guidance and understanding.

In order to allow the Holy Spirit to help us in our decisions, we need to open our hearts and minds to listen for guidance and understanding. We always want the 'smack on the back of the head' or that 'Ah-Ha moment' to let us know how to act and react, but how often does this actually happen! We need to open ourselves up to listening to the 'small voice' inside each of us, the moral compass that directs our hearts and minds to what God wants us to do.

As we begin the call process, all of us need to open our hearts and minds to discern how God is leading us to the person He has already identified as the next full-time pastor of Schoeneck Moravian Church. In our personal lives, make sure to listen for the 'small voice' (i.e., God's whisper). He knows what is best for each one of us. Trust in God as He will never fail you as stated in John 14:1, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, trust also in me (Jesus)".
