Northern Province Synod:

In addition to the uplifting worship, heartwarming fellowship, and usual business of Synod to vote on elections and resolutions, I was delighted to see all of the amazing things that are happening in the wider Moravian Church. Emerging Ministries like Tricklebee Cafe in Wisconsin, Essentials Cafe in Bethlehem, and You Belong Ministries in Wisconsin are doing significant work in local communities. The Debt Jubilee Project: For the Healing of the World endeavored to raise \$50,000 in 50 days to cancel medical debt. The Board of World Mission's Blessings Flow project is bringing water filters and access to clean drinking water to communities in Honduras.

Synod's theme "For the Healing of the World" and our Moravian theme "In All Things Love" were seen in discussions and resolutions about racial justice, mental health, gender identity, ending gun violence, supporting those in need of refuge and safety.

I was particularly moved when delegates were invited to greet the newly-elected Provincial Elders Conference (PEC) members. What was probably planned as a receiving line for the Right Hand of Fellowship became a celebration of our Unity in Christ as "Sing Hallelujah" was sung several times, hugs were shared, discussions continued, and no one wanted to leave. The Holy Spirit was there in that moment.

Convo:

I had participated in the Young Adult Convo to Prague and Herrnhut in 2007, and it was a life-changing experience, so I was excited to be going as a leader this time and facilitating those life-changing experiences for others.

In Prague, Czech Republic, we did the usual tourist things like Prague Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral, the Astronomical Clock, and a dinner cruise on the Vltava River, but the most memorable experiences were the churches. Our first few nights we met in a Lutheran church and were hosted by the local Lutheran bishop. In recognition of our ecumenical partnership, Holy Communion was served by our Moravian clergy who have been called to Lutheran churches, and the bishop sang the communion blessing in Slavic. We visited Bethlehem Chapel, where John Hus preached, and we saw the John Hus statue in Old Town Square (top photo).



After Prague, we visited Kunwald, where the Unitas Fratrum was formed in 1457, and celebrated Holy Communion at the Linden Tree. We saw the mission efforts of the Czech *Jednota Bratrska* (Unity of the Brethren) to welcome Ukrainian refugees into their communities and to provide sustainable community outreach like primary schools, music schools, trade schools, a coffee shop, a thrift shop, an ice cream shop, and beekeeping. When we talked to local Moravians, many had the same message: "Our churches are small. We don't have a lot of people. But we have this big mission outreach to serve the community."

In Herrnhut we enjoyed a Singstunde and worship with the congregation. We toured the Provincial offices building, God's Acre, and the Zinzendorf castle. We celebrated Holy Communion in the Berthelsdorf church, where August 13 renewal of the church happened. As we concluded with worship in Dresden, we were reminded that while Convo might be a "mountaintop experience," we needed to "take it off the mountain" and take our experiences back to our individual churches. Thank you for allowing me to do that here, and thank you for everything that Schoeneck is doing to contribute to the mission and outreach to our community, the wider Moravian Church, and the world.

ELDERS DEVOTION

Listen to the Children

Recently, as I was reading The Upper Room, one sentence from the daily devotion caught my attention. As a mother was leaving her son's bedroom as he was finishing his prayers, she heard him say, "Night-night, Jesus. Keep up the good work." This discouraged mother, heavily weighed down with a negative attitude, said to herself, *What good work?* What spoke to me was not the mother's ensuing revelation, but the encouraging words of the child. It reminded me of the passage from Isaiah 11:6 "And a little child will lead them".

Our Christian faith is centered on a child, whose birth was so important that wise and religious scholars traveled a thousand miles to worship him; a baby whose light of hope and salvation would eventually travel across the world and throughout the centuries. The wise men could have ignored the star; they could have ignored the baby. But they didn't. That baby had so much to give us beyond our wildest expectations.

Years later, Jesus would often surround himself with children, even when his disciples were skeptical. In Matthew 19: 14, Jesus said, *Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.* Jesus listened to the children.

Marian Wright Edelman, the founder of the Children's Defense Fund, authored a book in 1992 entitled *The Measure of Our Success*, where she writes that the future success of our nation and the world is dependent on our success in nurturing our children. To nurture them, we must know them and listen to them..

The children of Schoeneck are our children. We look to the Sunday school program to nurture their Christian learning and support their moral growth. But we all have a part to play in their lives. When a child is baptized into our church, we, the congregation, join in the covenant to accept our obligation to love and nurture them in Christ. We need to continue to get to know our children. They have much to teach us.

A long time ago, I came across a short story entitled *The Piano Tuner*. A small boy is watching a man tune a piano. As the man works, the boy begins to ask him all sorts of questions. The piano tuner patiently answers each one, often setting down his tools to give the child his full attention. When the piano tuner finishes his work, the boy asks him one final question. *Do you know what I want to do when I grow up?* The man responds, "Tune pianos?" "No," said the boy. "I want to talk to children."

Congregational Baking of Lovefeast Cake

As all Moravians know, the serving of baked goods (sugar cake, bun, cookie, etc.) and a beverage, known as a lovefeast, is the celebration of a common meal as an act of fellowship during a service of song. It is not a sacrament nor a substitute for Holy Communion. The Lovefeast began in 1727 as a revival of the Agape meal in the early Christian Church.

Schoeneck is one of a very few Moravian churches that conducts lovefeast services 12-13 times each year. For each lovefeast, a piece of sugar cake and a beverage (usually lightened coffee and chocolate milk) is served to all those in attendance. Years ago, there were several bakeries that made the yeast-raised sugar cake with butter holes. However, these bakeries have dwindled to a precious few. In addition, there has been a significant increase in cost for the cake and beverages for each service. In 2023, sponsoring a lovefeast costs \$180!

Earlier this year, two Schoeneck members, Lori Hahn and Terry Berger, proposed the idea of having congregation members make the lovefeast sugar cakes. On June 24, Terry used his recipe to conduct a Moravian lovefeast baking class in the Fellowship Hall kitchen for interested members by making several lovefeast sugar cakes. This event was attended by around 20 members, young and not-so-young, male and female. The result was a delicious lovefeast sugar cake enjoyed by all in the class and served the next day at the Married People's Lovefeast with rave reviews!!!

As a result, the Board of Elders have decided to continue this 'new' tradition by in-house baking of sugar cakes or other delicious baked goods for selected lovefeasts. According to Terry, the current cost of ingredients for baking two (2) trays of lovefeast sugar cake is \$40. A schedule has been developed and posted on the bulletin board outside the church office for members to **sponsor** the baking of the lovefeast goodies and sign up to **bake** these lovefeast items. For the remainder of 2023, the sponsorship of lovefeasts will remain at \$180, regardless whether the sugar cake or other items are baked in-house or purchased. These funds will be applied to the purchase of baking ingredients (if the baker chooses to submit a bill) as well as coffee, chocolate milk and paper products. Starting in 2024, sponsoring a lovefeast is suggested to be \$100, whether baked in-house or purchased, for a total of \$1200 (i.e., 12 lovefeasts per year). As 2024 progresses, the sponsorship amount may change based upon the cost of ingredients, etc. In addition, it was suggested to keep one month's worth of sugar cake frozen as an emergency back-up in the event the baking schedule is interrupted.

The Elders are excited to bring another 'community-building' activity to Schoeneck that also helps the annual budget maintained by the Board of Trustees. Please make sure to stop by the bulletin board and reserve your chance to sponsor a lovefeast or help with the baking. Please contact Lori Hahn or Terry Berger for any questions.

So Close—Save the Date!

By the time you read this, the work on the organ will be very close to being completed. The pipes should be reinstalled, and all that will be left will be to make sure that everything sounds marvelous in the new environment. Technicians will be making final adjustments for about a week in early September.

We have also completed the fund-raising for this project! Thanks to the use of memorial funds from Carol Messinger, Carolyn Kratz, and Joy Shollenberger, we have reached our Challenge Goal of \$130,000!

We will celebrate the completion of this project on **Sunday, October 15**, when we will rededicate the refurbished organ with a lovefeast and Singstunde to mark the congregation's 261st anniversary. There will be only one service at 10:30 on that Sunday. Please mark your calendars now, and join us for a memorable service to hear the organ for the first time, and see how it blends with brass, voice, bells and timpani in praise and thanksgiving to God.

There will be a bulletin insert for the dedication Sunday with the name of *every* Organ Donor for this project. Please see the draft of the insert, and eventual plaque at the foot of the balcony stairs, by clicking on the link on the cover page of this e-mail, or a paper copy outside the church office or in the entryway by the elevator. If your name is not spelled correctly, or you would prefer to be called something else (Roberta instead of Bobbi, for example), or you contributed and your name is not included, please contact Sue Dreydoppel or the church office right away.

In a related project, we have also replaced the original organ blower motor from 1912. Jack Breidinger and Dennis Silvius discovered that the old motor had been overheating, which could cause a fire. Thanks to Jack's connections and Jack's and Dennis's labor, we were able to get replacement parts made at cost and engineering services donated.

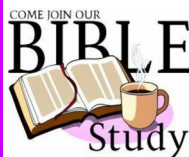
