# Schoeneck Moravian Church December 2023

### Advent—A Time of Preparation, Christmas—A Time of Joyous Celebration

In May of this year, the Schoeneck congregation was not prepared for the departure of our pastors. At that time, the Joint Board was presented with the challenge to participate in the call process with the direction of the Eastern District Executive Board (EDEB). The call process, albeit long and sometimes frustrating for the Joint Board, is a process of preparation, using prayer and discernment to identify the person God has already selected to lead our congregation.

Starting on December 3<sup>rd</sup> and lasting until December 24<sup>th</sup>, we begin preparing for another event, Advent. What is Advent? Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year when we prepare our hearts and minds for the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ as well as preparing for the Second Coming of Christ. We celebrate by placing an Advent wreath in the sanctuary with four (4) candles. One (1) candle is lit each Sunday and represents a different theme: First Sunday – Hope (the Prophecy Candle), Second Sunday – Peace (the Bethlehem Candle), Third Sunday – Joy (the Shepherd's Candle), Fourth Sunday – Love (the Angel's Candle). This year, the fourth Sunday of Advent is actually Christmas Eve, a very special time for the Schoeneck congregation when we have a lovefeast, an agape meal where we express our true unity in Christ and our love for one another, followed by bathing our sanctuary in soft, illuminating candlelight, waiting expectantly for the birth of Jesus.

As we end 2023 and enter into 2024, we leave a year filled with both personal and congregational ups and downs and enter a new one with anticipation and excitement. Throughout this Advent season, let us prepare by focusing on the meaning of each lit candle:

- -First Sunday, the Hope/Prophecy Candle praying for the hope that this Advent season will bring a renewed sense of calm when we turn our lives over to God (Psalm 42:5).
- -Second Sunday, the Peace/Bethlehem Candle listening to God's voice when we pray to Him, trusting in what He has planned for us (Romans 5:1).
- -Third Sunday, the Joy/Shepherd's Candle realizing that giving yourself over to God will bring exceeding amounts of joy (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).
- -Fourth Sunday, the Love/Angel's Candle expressing the love God has placed in our hearts to share with one another as He wants us to do (1 Corinthians 16:14).

Starting December 25 and lasting until January 6, the Epiphany of our Lord, we spend time in joyous celebration that our Savior was been born to save us. Try not to concentrate on all the glitter, sparkling lights and other things that are part of this season, rather share that joy with family and friends.

My wish for the members of the Schoeneck congregation is to put aside all the little trivial things that enter our lives each and every day to give us anxiety and stress, and use that time to pray to Jesus thanking Him for what He has done for us. In addition, please pray for discernment for the Joint Board as they continue through the call process, trusting that God has already selected someone to lead our congregation.

We'll share updates on the roof project once the HCC congregation raises the remaining \$1,217 needed and the work kicks off.

#### More about Hope Christian Centre:

- Hope Christian Center is a small, but growing Moravian congregation in Southern Kenya. It was founded in July, 2017 by the Ray of Hope Moravian Mission in Kenya.
- -The church has 77 official members with an average of 60-65 members worshipping each week. The church outreaches to believers and non-believers, neighboring communities and those who are still growing in their faith.
- Rev. Samuel Musyoki is the full-time Moravian pastor. In addition to worship, prayer and Sunday School, the pastor and members go door-to-door in the local community to share the good news of Jesus Christ.

#### Hope Christian Centre's worship schedule is as follows:

- Morning Glory is held very early every morning of the week for prayer, giving thanks and singing worship songs for the glory of God
- On Wednesdays, Rev. Musyoki offers counseling and prayer
- Friday is prayer day for the whole church, 4pm-6pm
- Every three months, there is Holy Communion and baptisms are done

Looking to the future, the congregation's goal is to double the number of members. Additionally, the congregation aims to extend the Lord's kingdom throughout Kenya, reach and teach more youth, minister to women and offer conferences and seminars on relevant topics to members and the community.




## You're Invited to Christmas Caroling at Walden III on December 10!!


