SEASONS

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matthew 2: 1-2, 11)

At this time of year, there are many "seasons" taking place. There is the Season of Winter, which only began on December 21. Will it be cold and snowy, or unseasonably warm and rainy this year? Will we have Snow Days, or will they all be Remote Learning Days this year?

There is the Season of Football, with one month remaining, during which we either rejoice or despair about how the Eagles are doing in the pre-Super Bowl frenzy.

And then there is the Season of Epiphany, from January 6 until Ash Wednesday, this year on February 14. Epiphany celebrates when the Wise Men, or Magi, reached Bethlehem and delivered their gifts. In many cultures, January 6 is the time to open your presents, rather than Christmas or Christmas Eve. It is also the time to celebrate the end of the Twelve Days of Christmas.

Even though the focus of Epiphany as a day is often on gifts, there is a more subtle focus on Epiphany as a season in the church. The season celebrates the church in a wider world, that Jesus came not only for the Jews, but for non-Jews as well. The Magi were from a non-Jewish culture, and they represent the Gentiles, those people who were not Jews. They represent US!

The Gospel lessons for the Sundays after Epiphany are about Jesus' early ministry, again showing that the Jewish Messiah is also the Messiah of Gentiles as well.

The word "epiphany," not capitalized, has another meaning: that lightbulb-over-the-head moment when you suddenly understand something very important. Will we as a congregation or as individuals have such a moment during 2024? Will our community, our country, and the world suddenly realize that war, hatred, bloodshed, distrust, and hostility are destructive?

May one of our prayers for the coming uncertain year be, "Deliver us from the sins which lead to war and conflict, and strengthen within us the will to establish righteousness and justice on the earth. . . Hasten the day when the kingdom of the world shall become your Kingdom, and by grace make us worthy to stand before you. Amen." (Moravian Book of Worship, liturgy for Intercessions in Time of Crisis, p. 118.)

Financial Report from Youth Rally Weekend To Schoeneck Moravian Church

The Moravian Youth Council Rally was held October 6-8, 2023, at Schoeneck Moravian Church in Nazareth, PA. Although we had been told to prepare for 200-250 participants, registration came only to 149 people from ten congregations.

DEBT JUBILEE PROJECT FOR THE HEALING OF THE WORLD

At the 2023 Northern Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church, the Moravian Ministries Foundation and Board of World Mission offered an opportunity for Moravians in North America to make a difference in the world. The goal of the **Debt Jubilee Project: For the Healing of the World** was to raise \$50,000 in 50 days to forgive medical debt in the US and at the Moravian medical ministry in Ahuas, Honduras.

The final total raised was more than double the goal, raising \$102,424.47! This represented 284 donations from people representing 71 congregations, including Schoeneck. Thanks to their support, **over \$10 million in medical debt was eliminated in 37 US counties** where there is a Moravian presence. Almost 13,500 individuals and families received a letter that their medical debt was being forgiven, with no further action required.

Specifically, in Northampton County, there were 463 recipients, abolishing over \$350,000 in medical debt. In Lehigh County, there were 750 recipients, removing almost \$700,000 in medical debt. That's over \$1 million in crushing medical debt eliminated just in the Lehigh Valley!

While the names of the recipients have not been released, we know that there are Schoeneck members and friends who face the burden of medical debt. They will especially understand the relief and gratitude that the recipients of this gift are feeling.

Including the funds which went to the clinic in Nicaragua, this brief project of 50+ days relieved almost \$11 million in medical debt. As noted by the sponsoring partners of this project, "When we all pool our resources and work together, we can make a big difference in the world." Amen!

Tell Me About Synod Part I



What is a District Synod?

A District Synod is a gathering of representatives from Moravian congregations belonging to a District (a subdivision) within a Province of the Moravian Church. Its purpose is to confirm, renew, and establish bonds of Christian love and fellowship both among individual members and between congregations and to stimulate and strengthen ministry undertaken together.

Significantly, in the Moravian Church the majority of those in attendance at synods are lay persons, rather than clergy. Such representation is reflective of the church's conviction that sharing the good news of Jesus Christ is the calling of the entire church, rather than a task restricted to those called to ordained ministry.

DISTRICT SYNOD DELEGATE will represent our congregation at the Moravian Church Eastern District Synod held in Bethlehem June 26-29, 2024. Delegates will vote and share in shaping resolutions to direct the ministry of the Moravian Church.
