The Lord is Risen!

Next Sunday will be celebrating Easter, with brass chorales and alleluias in worship, and breakfast from the Manly Men of Schoeneck. But Easter isn't finished once we eat the last chocolate egg. According to the church calendar, the season of Easter continues for seven Sundays.

What if we were to celebrate Easter for those additional weeks? During Lent, some people give up something they like. Others try to add a spiritual discipline. What if we were to celebrate the season of Easter by adding something to our church community life?

For example, we might see a lot of members and visitors on Easter Sunday that we haven't seen at worship for a while, maybe not since Christmas. If your attendance has been lagging lately, and you can't claim a health reason (this doesn't apply to the homebound or those with health or mobility issues), why not make an effort to attend worship a little more often?

You can try a new activity at church. Bring your children to Sunday School or youth activities—there is still time for them to take part and have fun. Give an hour or two to help prepare for the rummage sale in June or help with a community dinner. Try out a Bible Study or an adult Sunday School class or come to just one Women's Fellowship gathering.

The season of Easter is also a good time to consider your giving to the church, since Easter celebrates that God gave God's Son for our life (John 3:16: "*For God so loved the world that he gave his only son. . .*" you know the rest) and that Jesus gave his life for us (Romans 8:32: "*He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?*").

Probably everyone agrees that we should give back in gratitude to God. But last year, almost 40% of Schoeneck giving units gave *nothing* to the church. Another 25% gave less than \$10 per week. At least they gave *something*. Perhaps now, in celebration of Easter, is the time to reevaluate your giving.

There is no recommended amount to give. Everyone's circumstances are different. Author and theologian C.S. Lewis writes: "I do not believe one can settle how much we ought to give. I am afraid the only safe rule is to give more than we can spare." Or, as Trustee Troy Schoeneberger told the members of the confirmation class, "Give what's right, not what's left."

As with New Year's resolutions, what you try may not last. But you just might find an activity or a group of people who add meaning to your life. And that may be an excellent way to keep the season of Easter alive, even without chocolate eggs.

The Lord is Risen! The Lord is Risen indeed!

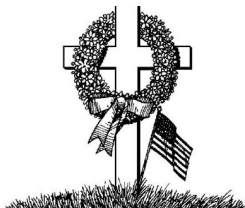

ELDERS DEVOTION

“Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted.” Psalm 25:16

When I was in college, I read Carson McCullers, *The Heart Is A Lonely Hunter*, a novel that explores themes of isolation, longing and the search for connection. The book was lost on me. Young and naive, secure in my sheltered upbringing and limited exposure to a wider world that contained alienation and loneliness, I found the message beyond comprehension and empathy. Even as a Christian, loneliness remained a distant reality of others that I only acknowledged on the surface. My heart remained silent.

Who knows the exact time the Holy Spirit speaks to you and moves you in a certain direction. That is what happened to me when I rather unwillingly said yes to visiting “lonely” people thirty years ago. (I knew it was the right thing to do; I just wasn’t crazy about doing it.) Through the ensuing years, I have visited residents in nursing homes, people living alone, people who are grieving. As time goes by, I have witnessed the depths of loneliness that penetrate many of us: isolated people; people who feel invisible and forgotten; even people sitting next to you in worship on Sunday. We need to connect with and assure these members of God’s family—our family—that they are not alone. Jesus reached out to the broken-hearted, the outcasts, the forgotten ones. In his humanity, he knew what it was like to feel rejected and alone.

We need to acknowledge our brothers and sisters who suffer from loneliness. Reach out to them and let them know that they are not alone and that their lives matter. No one is an island; no one should stand alone.

MORAVIAN MISSION CORNER

Blessings Flow: an initiative of the Moravian Board of World Mission bringing clean, safe drinking water in hurricane-ravaged Honduras.

Blessings Flow, in partnership with local churches and the non-profit One ATTA Time, has provided household water filtration via five-gallon buckets coupled with EPA-approved water filters to over 400 families in the La Moskitia region as many families there cannot afford treated water or sufficient equipment to purify water at home. The water filters last for 10 years.

La Moskitia is a very poor region of Honduras severely impacted by Hurricanes Eta and Iota. Local families obtain their water from contaminated shallow wells and/or the nearby rivers where they also bathe and wash clothes. As a result, waterborne gastrointestinal and skin diseases are all too common. In one of the villages, it was reported that 100% of the families had someone in their household who had experienced diarrhea in the previous two weeks due to a waterborne illness, 40% of the families had experienced other symptoms like headache or fatigue, and 20% of the families reported that someone in their household had missed school or work due to symptoms.

To date:

- As of 01 January, enough funding has been raised so that every family in the first 5 villages will receive a water filter (phase 1)
- The next phase aims to bring clean water for at least a decade in every home in 10+ communities
- Over \$150,000 has been raised to share the blessing of safe, clean drinking water
- Most importantly, health and hope will be restored via clean, safe water in an area where 100% of families experience symptoms of waterborne illness

The Board of World Mission has staff and partners on the ground in Honduras continuing the work and making plans for the future. We will continue to share about this project as additional locations are identified and filters are distributed.

Bethlehem Area Moravian (BAM) Freezer Ministry and Garden Gatherers (an Ecumenical/Community Program)

What is Bethlehem Area Moravian (BAM) Freezer Ministry and Garden Gatherers?

About six times a year, members of the Bethlehem Area Moravian Churches meet at East Hills Moravian Church to cook, pack, and freeze major quantities of food for distribution through any of our churches. This ministry assists anyone who is going through times of transition, having difficulty cooking, or experiencing long-term food insecurity.

The Gathering program is where churches gather on Sundays and bring vegetables and fruits to East Hills Moravian Church on Tuesday of distribution week. On Tuesday, of distribution week, willing volunteers go to pick-up vegetables and fruit from established local farms, local gardens and Second Harvest, part of Feed America for many items. After the food has been loaded, it will be distributed to seven local community schools to be unloaded and prepared to be given out on Wednesdays.

- 109 individual servings of hot chocolate (envelopes)
- 71.5 pounds of coffee

Safe Harbor serves not only their residents, but large numbers of homeless people who drop in for some relief from the cold weather. There is a huge need for hot drink supplies. They thank us, and we thank God for the generosity of the folks at Schoeneck.

New Organ Maintenance Fund

The Trustees have established a new long-term fund to be used for future organ maintenance. After all the invoices for the organ project were paid, there was a little over \$1,000 left, which is being used to begin the fund. Contributions can be made to the fund by designating memorial gifts to it or by specifying “organ maintenance fund” on any contribution.

Additional Organ Pipe Donors

The additional and final rank of organ pipes has been installed. The 32 new pipes are a Leiblich Flute 16-foot pedal rank. They are played by the organ pedals, and provide a softer low sound, complementing the other pedal pipes. Since the new pipes are supposed to be played along with other pipes, they don't sound like much on their own, but they add to the total sound.

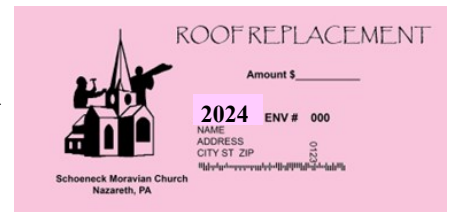
